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


FDA CVM's ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE HISTORY

- 1996-National Antimicrobial Resistance Monitoring System (NARMS) is established.
- ➤ 2003-Guidance for Industry #152 –FDA drug approvals are based on risk assessment for antimicrobial resistance.
- ➤ 2010-Guidance for Industry #209-FDA established judicious use practices of medically important antimicrobials.
- ➤ 2013-Guidance for Industry #213-FDA established the three year time line to convert OTC status to VFD for medicated feed products and Rx for medicated drinking water products.
- ➤ January 1, 2017-21 CFR Part 558 requires all medically important antimicrobials to be dispensed as a VFD or Rx drug order.

COMAR Title 15, Department of Agriculture, Subtitle 14 Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, Chapter 1; Standards of Practice and Code of Ethics for the Practice of Veterinary Medicine in the State (COMAR 15.14.01.01)

A Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) exists when:

> RESPONSIBILTY ESTABLISHED

> SUFFICIENT KNOWLEDGE AND TIMELY VISITS

> AVAILABILITY





DISTRIBUTORS MUST NOTIFY FDA CVM

ONE TIME NOTIFICATION

- As of December, 2015: 4 Maryland Distributors had notified FDA CVM
- As of August, 2016: 30 Maryland Distributors have notified FDA CVM
- As of December 31, 2016: **59** Maryland Distributors have notified FDA CVM





PRODUCER REQUIREMENTS

- ➤ Producer must obtain a VFD or Rx order from their veterinarian for medically important antimicrobials.
- A extralabel use of a medically important antimicrobial is not allowed.
- ➤ No refills are allowed
- ➤ No usage after the expiration date is allowed.
- ➤ Maintain a copy of the VFD for 2 years
- ➤ Maintain a copy of the Rx for 5 years-MD pharmacy laws and regulations

MARYLAND LAW

SENATE BILL 422 AND HOUSE BILL 602 KEEP ANTIBIOTICS EFFECTIVE ACT OF 2017

KEY POINTS TO THE LAW

- Keep Antibiotics Effective Act of 2017 became a law on October 1, 2017
- ➤ On December 1, 2019. Maryland Department of Agriculture shall report to the General Assembly Maryland usage of medically important antimicrobials.
- > This law does not apply for reporting antimicrobial usage:
 - > for a cattle operation that sells fewer than 200 cattle per year
 - > for a swine operation that sells fewer than 200 swine per year
 - ➤ for a poultry operation that sells fewer than 60,000 birds per year
- A working group has been established in Animal Health to carry out this law.
